## **Administration Overview**

Work progressed on the budget and pro-forma statements. I also sat down with Bellevue to review the Fire Department budget and funds. We also discussed the financial situation in both cities and how it will relate to putting together recommendations to the Fire Board for their budget. We will submit something to the board next week for review.

I hosted a conference call with SD1 and Cardinal Engineering to discuss a possible storm water project at 4<sup>th</sup> and Walnut. Recently a sink hole opened up in this area that might provide an opportunity for us to fast-track some improvements that have been discussed for some time.

Phil and I met a developer up off of Edwards about a project being pursued. The County P&Z department was also there and has been working with the individual on his plans.

The Comprehensive Plan committee met on Wednesday night. The meeting was very insightful and we had a lot of good dialogue on setting a foundation and collecting public feedback that will lead into a much bigger public input session. We all look forward to sharing more details about that in the coming weeks and months.

I will be out of the office on Friday attending a mandatory FEMA meeting in Louisville as part of our report for some reimbursement on costs associated with the February Ohio River flooding.
