Administration Overview

I was able to spend a good amount of time this week working on the budget and pro-forma analysis for some upcoming meetings. I am pleased with some changes I have made to the budget and the finance committee seemed to like those changes as well when we met last month.

After the council meeting I spent some time following up on some information you requested and looked at some areas of the city that came up in the meeting as well.

I have been working this week on some logistics of the new portions of Manhattan Blvd. with the developers. There is some resolution that will be needed in the coming weeks before I would recommend the city taking over ownership on those sections of new pavement.

Bob Yoder received word that we were awarded funds for a grant he wrote to be applied towards expenses related to Vine Street Park. The award amount is TBD, but likely around \$2,000.

Fire Department

The Fire Board held a special meeting on April 30th and a majority of the board formally recommended former Fire Chief, Mike Auteri, for the open Chief's position. With both Mayors and the majority of the Fire Board in agreement an offer has been extended to Mr. Auteri for the position.

Economic Development/Grants/Etc.

• Manhattan Harbour:

 The development team constructing the Gateway Apartment site is currently working on plans for their next development site at Manhattan Harbour and has until May 14th to get those plans in to our Planning and Zoning staff for a June 6th meeting.

• Sixth Avenue Streetscape Improvement:

Oue to the turnaround time for delivery of the lights we will likely hold off on construction of this project until immediately after Memorial weekend.
