Administration Overview

As previously reported, Republic Services will be updating the trash schedule in both the City of Dayton. The change will take place on **October 14th**. Dayton residents will still receive trash pick-up **ONCE PER WEEK** but your date of service will be either Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday based on location. The Planning and Zoning Board met on Wednesday and began to discuss the new Comprehensive Plan draft that is now [available for review online](#). The board will meet again on November 6th at 7:00PM at the High School Administrative Building to weight in on the presented “Goals and Objectives” and “Land Use” maps. I encourage everyone to attend as this will be a great opportunity to make public comments regarding the document.

Property Tax Bills will be going out in the mail. The bills are due EOD December 2nd.

KYTC contacted me late this week to state they would be starting another study aimed at collecting data for our request to test 6th and Berry as a 4-way stop. I don’t expect much to come from this as they seem to not understand that we simply want to potentially test this change for a short amount of time just to see how it goes.

Economic Development/Grants/Etc.

- **Manhattan Harbour:**
 - Developers are getting closer to closing on the financing of a 98 units project on roughly 6 acres along the river.
- **Sidewalk Improvement Project (Right-of-Way Phase):**

- DunRobin and Associates have started to contact property owners.
- **New City Building Project**
 - SHP has completed a first draft of their report. The Mayor and I plan on meeting with them and City Staff in the next few weeks to discuss floorplans.
