City of Dayton: Goals and Objectives

HOUSING

- 1. Encourage investment in residential properties.
 - a. Provide incentives for the rehabilitation of existing housing.
 - b. Review and update city ordinances regarding the maintenance of property.
 - c. Create community clean-up events to improve distressed or vacant properties.
- 2. Strive to increase the rate of owner-occupancy over time.
 - a. Promote state and local assistance programs for first-time home buyers.
 - b. Build stronger relationships with area real estate professionals.
- 3. Ensure and promote a diverse range of housing choices.
 - a. Encourage a variety of housing types and densities that meet the needs of residents at all stages of life.
 - b. Encourage energy-efficiency investments to increase long term affordability.
 - c. Support the Dayton Housing Authority to provide safe and affordable housing opportunities and related supportive services.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Promote investment in the central business district to attract and retain businesses.
 - a. Develop a marketing strategy to attract visitors and advertise Dayton's local businesses.
 - b. Create developer packages that illustrate the potential of available sites.
 - c. Utilize the city's Commercial Community Advantage Program (CCAP) to implement uniform signage and façade improvements.
- 2. Create a supportive entrepreneurial network.
 - a. Create a monthly economic update E-newsletter.
 - b. Streamline the process to obtain an occupational/business license.

TRANSPORTATION

- 1. Develop an efficient, safe, and connective transportation system that serves the existing and projected travel needs of the community.
 - a. Work closely with regional transportation planning agencies to improve accessibility, accommodate traffic volumes, and provide roadway maintenance.
 - b. Improve safety by ensuring proper signage, striping, lighting, and pedestrian facilities.
- 2. Develop an accessible and integrated transportation network that balances the needs of all users.
 - a. Implement complete streets principles to accommodate pedestrians, bicyclists, and users of mass transit.
 - b. Enhance streetscape design standards to create inviting environments that encourage walking or bicycling.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES

- 1. Provide community facilities that improve the quality of life for all citizens. (schools, libraries, recreation centers, health care facilities, administrative, fire and police stations, etc.)
 - a. Connect new and existing parks and open spaces with accessible trails and greenways.
 - b. Expand current programming of public spaces that foster interactive community events.
- 2. Provide adequate and dependable utilities that will serve existing and future developments.
 - a. Coordinate with all essential utility providers regarding infrastructure upgrade needs and extension of services to new development.
- 3. Ensure that all necessary functions of government are performed in the most responsible manner possible.
 - a. Structure government activities to meet the immediate needs and long-term objectives of the community.
 - b. Provide community leadership that is both accessible and responsive to the public.

LAND USE

- 1. Establish a future land use map that strengthens Dayton's identity and is current with changing growth conditions in the region.
- 2. Locate and design new development that will be compatible with adjacent uses and will benefit the public health, safety, and welfare of the community.
 - a. Encourage redevelopment or adaptive reuse of vacant or underutilized buildings and sites.
 - b. Promote infill development to encourage a more compact form and avoid costly sprawl.
 - c. Adopt smart growth principles.
- 3. Establish Main Street as the commercial, mixed-use center of Dayton.
 - a. Promote a mix of neighborhood commercial uses along Main Street, including residential, retail, office, and community spaces.
 - b. Support pedestrian-oriented design features such as lighting, street furniture, and signage.
