FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT FOR MARCH 2020

FIRE & EMS Report For March 2020

Response calls: 64 Fire runs and 130 EMS calls were made in March, for a total of 194 runs.

CPR: There were no CPR classes held in March.

Training: We completed 1020 hours of training in March. Training topics included aerial and pump operations, driver's training, fire cause and origin, and the 48-hour EMS refresher course was completed. We are required to have at least 100 hours of fire training yearly, along with 48 hours of EMS training every two years. That calendar resets every January 1. We continue to train daily to stay sharp and learn new skills.

FIRE INSPECTIONS

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we have suspended inspections and are only addressing life safety issues, or in the case of The Tapestry and Kent Lofts, doing final occupational inspections so they can begin having residents move in.

PUBLIC ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS.

With the pandemic occurring, we have eliminated all public activities or events. To ensure the safety of the crews and the citizens, movement outside of the fire station has been pared way down to emergency responses and only essential trips. We have implemented protective measures to ensure that when we respond the crew members are protected and we are able to properly assess, treat and transport patients.

Operationally, we are still a functioning fire house. Our run numbers are actually up compared to this time last year. Fortunately, to date we have not had any positive cases of Covid-19 (that we are aware of). Any time we have a concern, I am in

constant contact with the hospitals. We have also implemented a detailed decontamination process for the ambulance, fire trucks and the fire house. This is ongoing and following CDC guidelines. The men and woman here continue to respond and maintain the high level of professionalism that the communities have grown to expect, even with this added level of high stress and uncertainty. The cities should be proud of the department.
